It's also important to acknowledge our own place in the story of colonization.

A Note from the Director

I am honored to present to you a story about the power of art, the struggle for freedom, and the strength of desire. Based on real events in Haiti, set in a time of revolution, our play follows a group of intertwined individuals who find themselves confronted with difficult choices and the harsh reality of censorship and oppression.

Our characters are passionate and determined people, willing to risk everything for the sake of their dreams. And as the revolution unfolds around them, they find themselves caught up in a world of violence and chaos, where every decision they make has life-or-death consequences.

In New City Players' production of Cry Old Kingdom, we hold up a mirror to our own world in 2023, of insurrections, book bans, and unjust legislation.

Raising questions about the role of art in society, and the ways in which censorship and oppression can threaten the very essence of human expression. We hope to shed light on the struggles of those who seek to create in the face of adversity, and to inspire a sense of empathy and understanding for those who fight for their right to be heard.

This play is a dance with desire – the desire to create, to love, and to live freely. It is a tribute to the resilience of the human spirit, and the Haitian people – a people that cannot and will not be broken.

Our production has been a labor of love by our cast, crew, and NCP ensemble. It is a gift to tell this story, and it takes a village.

We hope you will join us on this journey and let the passion you experience this evening ignite you with inspiration.



Revolutionary Connections

When asked to provide a six-word summary of *Cry Old Kingdom*, writer Jeff Augustin had the following to say about the haunting journey of his characters:

"Beautiful landscapes don't make revolutions easier."

As is abundantly clear from the play, revolutions are seldom, if indeed ever easy; and for all their necessity, they often come at quite a high cost. For instance, to escape the shackles of slavery, early Haitian people rose up to revolt against the French colonizers who had oppressed and enslaved them, becoming in 1804 the first independent Black republic in the world.

However, in breaking free, Haiti became subject to social and economic sanctions from other nations threatened by their burgeoning independence, which is one of the reasons the country remains so impoverished today.

In light of such costs, it can sometimes be hard to find the strength to keep fighting those necessary battles; to keep fighting for our rights and for our freedom, and to keep power in the hands of those who can be trusted to wield it as opposed to those who might use it to oppress. The true story of Papa Doc Duvalier revisited in *Cry Old Kingdom* is a story that demonstrates what happens when too much power becomes concentrated in the hands of one fallible individual; and when, without freedom of expression, an artist loses his vision and a dancer loses her voice.

And though at first glance, the bleak world these characters inhabit may seem a far cry from our own lives and all their liberties, it also wasn't so long ago that the events of January 6th, 2021 briefly seemed to threaten the structures that keep our country's power from unjustly congregating in the hands of one—potentially quite destructive—man.

As Americans, it can be easy for us to take the freedoms we have for granted; but this story is one that may serve as a reminder of the fact that the freedom to speak, create, and rebel are in fact an immense privilege—and thus an immense responsibility. If too many of us neglect that responsibility by failing to protect those freedoms, we may unwittingly open the door to a world where we

see them eliminated—a world where all stories would be gradually replaced by silence, and the human capacity for connection would be forever stifled by a scourge of terror and despair.

Along with serving as an inspiration and opportunity to learn about Haiti's rich cultural landscape, I hope that this play serves as an inspiration for you to reflect on what we can all learn from even the darker aspects of its history; and especially about the necessity of embracing the full power of our voices in order to assure that every voice remains heard.




