Welcome to the world of Stephen Brown's *Little Montgomery*. It has been a pleasure to help bring this story to you. We hope you will have a great time and tell your friends all about Megan and Kimmy and Rick and Larry and Chet and Patty. About their exploits and antics. About their passion and about their love.


Life is a journey. It is about change, exploring what is possible, listening to your intuition, taking chances, and growth. I believe the most formative time for this evolution is adolescence. It's that nebulous time between childhood and adulthood. It's a time when what defined us in our earlier years no longer fits. Something is off, something makes us uncomfortable. It's a time when the answer to the question, "what do you want to be when you grow up", feels vital. Astronaut, Princess, Transformer, will no longer suffice. We need more substantial answers. We are demanding it of ourselves. Who are we? What are we? How are we? It's also about much more than a career choice; it's a time when we feel the urgency to discover our truths. This yearning is what prompts our

story to begin. Megan's story. She and her "soul friend" Kimmy hatch a plan and we witness its unfolding.

When we tell stories about moments in our lives. we usually don't recall or describe every detail surrounding the events, but rather only what is needed to convey its essence. Many things are generalized and conflated as we tell a tale. This holds true in *Little Montgomery*. The play gives us details about the characters and their relationships but keeps the details about "when" and "where" in a vague haze of irrelevance. By allowing us to focus on the "who", the "what", and "how" they affect each other, the relationships become the focus, and the "why" is left to each of us to appreciate from our own perspective. It's a play about the value of family and friends and the significance they play in our lives. This is the sensibility with which I approached the process of directing the play. I wanted to find a way to emphasize the characters and their relationships and keep the surroundings more conceptually abstract. Our entire team came together to help realize that vison and I am grateful for their remarkable collaborative contributions.

Many times, while going through the rehearsal process, *Little Montgomery* reminded me of my tumultuous adolescent escapades and made me laugh. I hope our story will affect you as well and take you back to memories of your own teenage adventures. Perhaps, at dinner after the show, or out for a drink or a cup of coffee, you'll share those stories with each other. Share your exploits and antics. Share your passion and your love... and laugh.




